

Northern Sydney Symphonic Wind Ensemble (NSSWE) Participant Code of Conduct (Junior version)

Purpose

This document outlines how NSSWE expects its participants to behave at all times when they can be identified as NSSWE members.

It's not a general guideline, it's a firm expectation.

This Code of Conduct applies to all musicians participating in an NSSWE program or activity.

Professionalism and Commitment

NSSWE encourages all participants to

- Behave as a professional ensemble member would behave
- Be courteous at all times
- Show respect for your fellow musicians, your Conductor, your Orchestral Managers, and your audiences.

Safe behaviour

NSSWE wants all musicians to feel safe and supported while they are at NSSWE.

Participants in NSSWE programs will not:

- Use words or language that are unfair, threatening, insulting or harmful to others
- Intimidate, bully or cyber-bully other ensemble members
- Film or take photographs of other ensemble members
- Touch other ensemble members, or use any form of violence.

You must report any unsafe behaviour to the NSSWE Conductor or the Orchestral Manager.

If a musician demonstrates unsafe behaviour during an NSSWE activity, they will be removed, and their parents or carers will be contacted immediately.

Standards of behaviour

NSSWE expects all musicians to:

- Protect the positive reputation of NSSWE
- Play your instrument to the best of your ability
- · Behave with responsibility, honesty and care
- · Treat others as you would expect to be treated
- Protect the privacy of other ensemble members
- Not share any information about NSSWE or other ensemble members on social media, including Facebook or any other online forum
- Obey all reasonable instructions given by the Conductor, the Orchestral Manager and any volunteer supervisors.

NSSWE does not permit the use of drugs, cigarettes and alcohol at any NSSWE activity.

Attendance

All musicians are expected to:

- Make sure you know the time and date of your rehearsals and performances
- Arrive at least 15 minutes before the scheduled start time
- Be seated and ready to rehearse at the start time.
- Let the Manager know if you cannot attend an NSSWE activity, and leave your folder with the Orchestral Manager if you know you are going to be away for a rehearsal or performance.
- Contact your Orchestral Manager by text message if you are arriving late, and always apologise to the Conductor when you arrive
- Not leave a rehearsal or performance early, unless you are sick or have some other emergency.
 You must ask the Conductor to excuse you, and you must tell a member of NSSWE staff before leaving.

Rehearsal etiquette

All musicians are expected to:

- Keep all mobile phones and electronic devices switched off and out of sight during rehearsals
- Pay full attention and not talk when the Conductor is working with the ensemble
- Help to set up and put away chairs, music stands and percussion equipment, and clear away any rubbish after a rehearsal or performance
- Keep tidy rehearsal rooms, dressing rooms and performance venues
- Bring your music folder and a 2B pencil and eraser to every rehearsal
- Practise your parts between rehearsals
- Take care of the music parts and folders that are given to you. Remember that these are NSSWE property, and you must return them at the end of the year.
- Percussion players are expected to provide their own mallets.

Child Safe Incident Reporting Process

If a participant breaks the rules set out in this NSSWE Participant Code of Conduct, they may:

- · Have their parents/guardians contacted to discuss the issue
- Be required to attend a meeting with the NSSWE Manager and Conductor
- Be asked to leave a rehearsal or activity immediately
- Be asked to leave the NSSWE program permanently
- Be the subject of a Child Safe Incident Report completed by NSSWE staff and kept on file.
